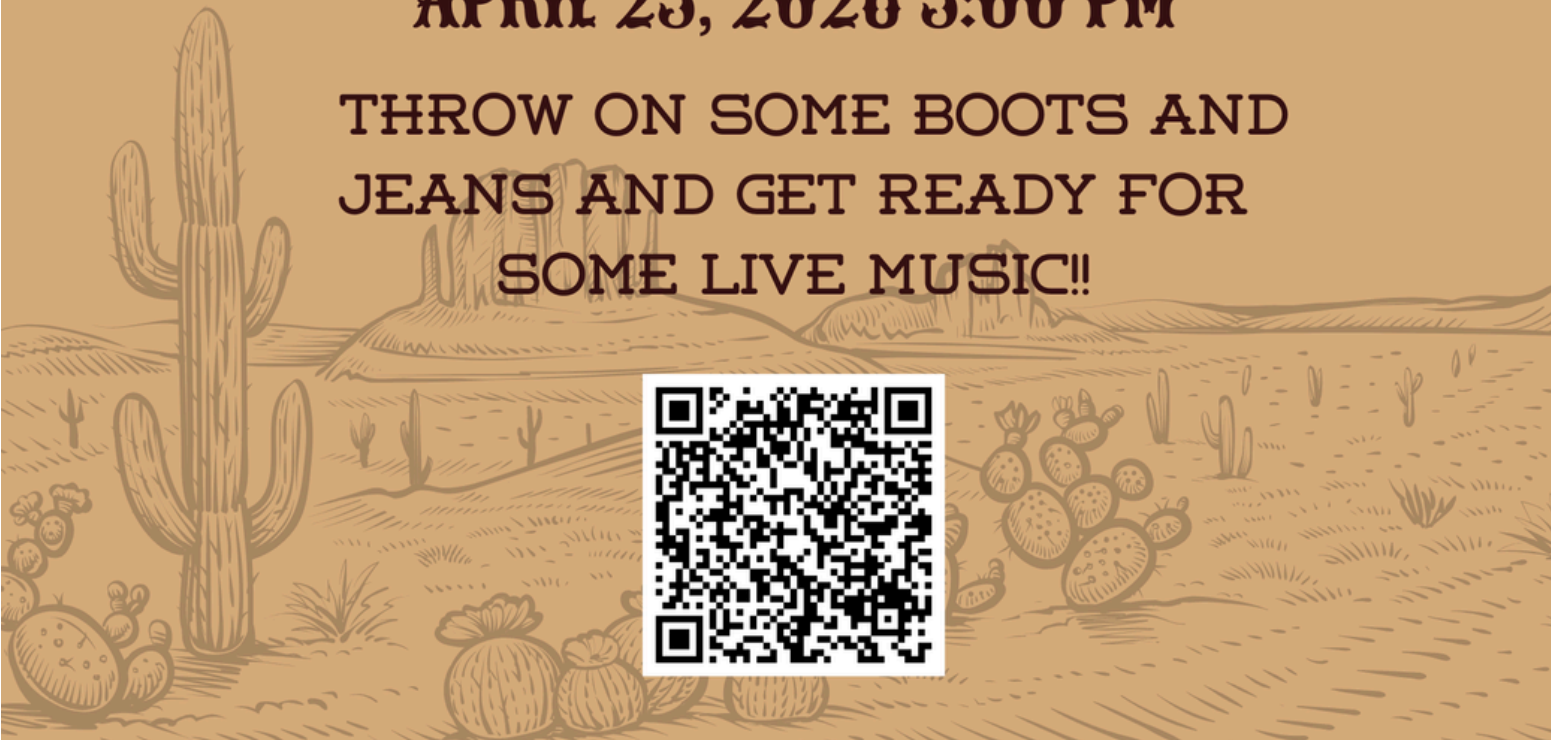

Memory Verse for February 2-6



John 13:34-35

A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.

The memory passage for next week focuses on love. Christians are called to love one another, and the foundation of that love is the love we have first received from Jesus—most clearly shown in His death on the cross and His resurrection for us.

It's important, though, to understand what Scripture means by *love* in this context. This is not the love of “falling in love,” nor is it primarily about affection or emotion. The passage was originally written in Greek, and the word used here refers to a steadfast, unconditional commitment. It is the kind of love that gives of itself for the good of another, placing their needs ahead of your own, regardless of the cost.

This is the love God has shown to us in Christ. And in this verse, Jesus calls His followers to extend that same kind of love to one another.

May God bless us with the desire to love as we have been loved by Him!
