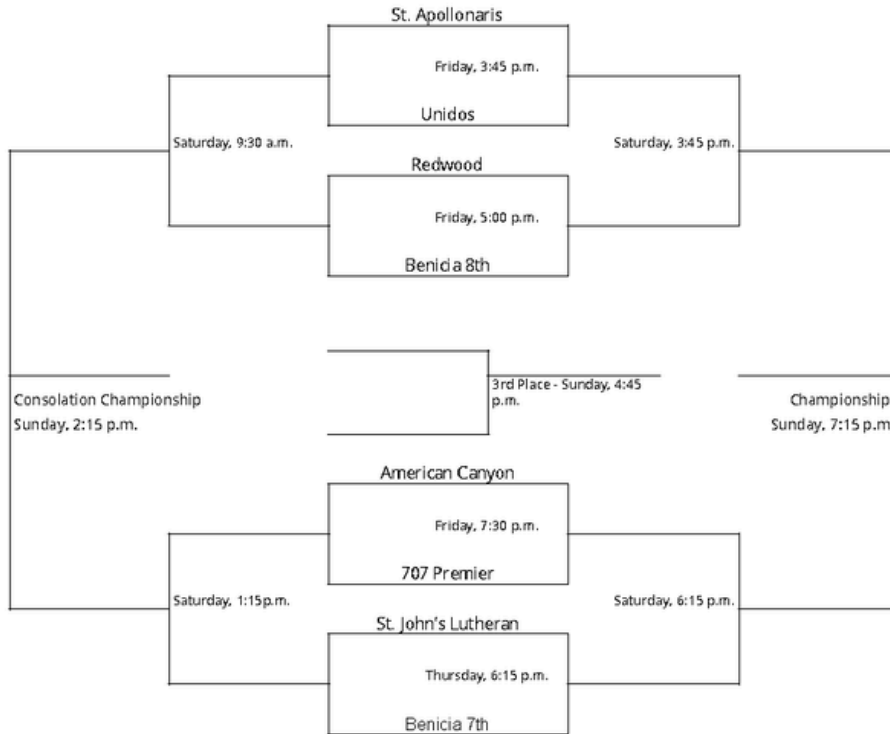

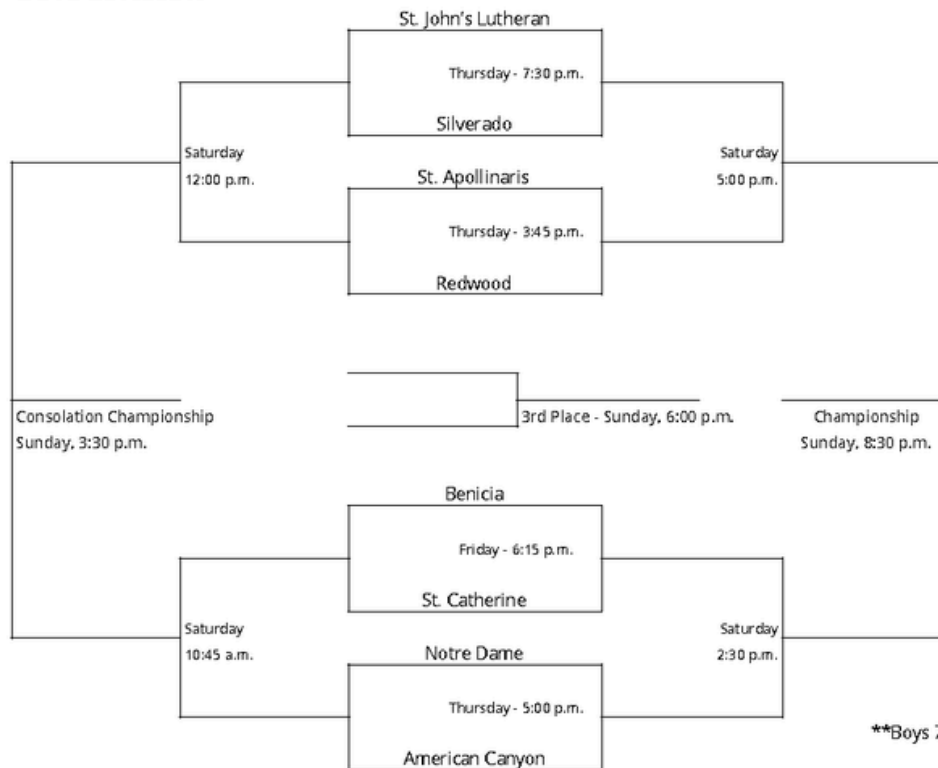

Maintenance Technician Needed

Position Description

Overview

The maintenance technician serves the church and school by contributing to the safe, reliable and cost-effective operation and maintenance of church buildings and grounds. He/she is primarily responsible for implementing and carrying out the preventive and routine maintenance tasks to prolong and ensure appropriate operation of equipment and systems; identifying repair/replacement needs necessary to maintain equipment and systems; and ensuring adequate materials are available to complete assignments in a timely manner. Ideally, this team member will have skill and experience supporting maintenance functions of a business or private entity and will have general knowledge of facility maintenance best practices.

Qualifications

- Must have good interpersonal skills and familiarity w/ SJLC
- Willing to serve
- Attention to detail
- Ability to climb and descend ladders
- Capable of lifting up to 100 pounds
- Preferred
 - o 3-5 years facility maintenance experience in a public or private organization
 - o General knowledge of building maintenance, carpentry, plumbing and electrical skills
 - o Troubleshooting competence

Duties and responsibilities

- Assist with maintaining a preventative maintenance program
- Make basic repairs to:
 - o Plumbing equipment
 - o Electrical systems
 - o Drywall, brick and wood work
 - o Light fixtures
 - o Hardware (doors, locks, gates, etc)
- Ensure basic fire equipment is operational:
 - o Fire extinguishers are regularly inspected
 - o Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are routinely checked and batteries properly charged
 - o Emergency exit signs are functioning
- Make certain roofs, rain gutters and drains are well-maintained and clear of debris
- Perform basic carpentry including cabinet and furniture repair
- Paint small areas when “touch ups” are needed
- Keep all general storage areas and the workshop area clean and organized
- Regularly inspect church campus and correct/repair and or replace needed items around church
 - o Assist facility manager to organize and retain maintenance and/or inspection records
 - o Use checklists to systematically (weekly/monthly/quarterly/annually/seasonally) inspect buildings, equipment and real property
- Notify facility manager of discrepancies and other matters requiring additional resources to resolve problems (eg. professional contractor, large financial obligation)
- Complete any other duties as required to sustain a safe, functional and beautiful campus

- o Regular Work Schedule: 10-20 hours per week

Memory Verse for January 12-16



Luke 9:23

Then he said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."

The memory passage for next week is following Jesus, even when it's hard.

Jesus was talking to His friends and followers, telling them what it really means to follow Him. He said it's not just about saying "I believe in Jesus" — it's about trusting Him and living like Him every day. It's about seeking to do what He would have us do, even when it's not easy.

It also has to do with treating others as Jesus calls us. That means choosing kindness when it's hard, sharing when you'd rather keep, and standing up for what's right even when others don't.

Taking up your cross doesn't mean carrying a heavy wooden beam. It means being brave enough to live like Jesus, even when it's not easy. It's about trusting Him and putting others first, just like He did.

Questions for Discussion

- What's one way you can "take up your cross" at this week — maybe by helping someone or being kind when it's tough?
- Is there something you need to "deny" (like selfishness or fear) so you can follow Jesus more closely?
