Memory Verse for May 18-22



Psalm 119:105

Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.

Have you ever walked through a dark room without a flashlight or nightlight? It's pretty easy to trip or bump into something. Life can feel like that sometimes—confusing or scary, with no clear direction.

Psalm 119:105 says, *“Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.”* That means God's Word helps guide us, step by step, like a flashlight on a dark trail. It doesn't always show us everything far ahead, but it gives us enough light to take the next right step.

But here's something even more amazing: the Bible tells us that **Jesus** is the **Light of the World** (John 8:12). That means He doesn't just *give* light—He *is* the light. When we follow Him, we don't have to walk in darkness. Jesus forgives our sins, shows us the way to live, and stays with us even when life is hard. And all of this He does as a gift of His love.

So if you're feeling unsure or like you're walking in the dark, remember: God's Word lights the way, and Jesus walks with you as your light, every step of the journey.

Discussion Questions:

1. What do you think it means for Jesus to be “the light of the world”? How does that help you in real life?
2. Can you think of a time when reading the Bible or remembering something about Jesus helped you know what to do?
